



### LOWER GENITAL TRACT LACERATIONS

- If neglected, can lead to multiple complications


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### REVIEW OF FEMALE PELVIC ANATOMY






# RISK FACTORS FOR HIGH ORDER LACERATION

- Midline episiotomy
- Nulliparity
- Longer second-stage labour
- · Precipitous delivery
- Persistent occiput posterior position
- Operative vaginal delivery
- · Increasing fetal birthweight
- · Asian inheritance

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# COMPLICATIONS OF HIGH ORDER LACERATIONS

- Short term:
  - Blood loss
  - Infection
  - Abscess
  - Perineal pain
  - Wound dehiscence
  - Necrotizing fasciitis

- Long term:
  - Urinary and fecal incontinence
  - Dyspareunia
  - · Altered sexual function
  - · Rectovaginal fistula
  - · Impaired pudendal nerve conduction


#### ASSESSMENT FOR OBSTETRIC TRAUMA


- Deliver the placenta!
- Set-up:
  - Materials (absorbable 2-0 or 3-0 suture)
  - Lightin
  - Exposur
- ANALGESIA
- Assess for
  - Extent of bleeding
  - Source of bleeding
- Identify:
  - Apex of vaginal laceration
  - Involvement of anorectum


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
### **REPAIR**


- Goals:
  - Hemostasis
  - · Restoration of anatomy
  - Minimization of pain
  - Avoidance of complications
- Step-Wise Approach:
  - Vaginal Repair
  - Crown Suture
  - Deep Perineal Repair
  - Superficial Perineal Repair
